As the President of the Ithaca PBA, an Executive Board Member of the Central New York Area Labor Federation, AFL-CIO, and the Spokesperson for the Ithaca Public Workers Coalition, I have been monitoring the situation between the Bangs Ambulance Company and Bangs Ambulance Workers United very closely. I've had conversations with the leadership of BAWU and have also had the opportunity to speak with Meghan, along with many of your employees, about what is undoubtedly a difficult set of circumstances for everyone involved.

Through my conversations, I have learned that despite the many challenges, progress is being made. As a fellow first responder, and labor executive, I am extremely heartened to have seen the advancement that the Bangs Ambulance Company and BAWU has made towards mutual ground and a final collective bargaining agreement.

Speaking personally from my experiences, I know contract negotiations can be exhausting and at times, emotionally draining. I also know this is unchartered territory for all of the involved parties at Bangs Ambulance which probably compounds and amplifies issues even further.

Despite the obvious challenges, I encourage you to continue speaking with the leadership of Bangs Ambulance Workers United, just as I encourage them to continue speaking with you. Our community relies on Bangs Ambulance for emergency medical care provided by professional, compassionate, local, career minded EMT's and Paramedics. My members, Ithaca Police Officers, also rely on Bangs Ambulance not just when conducting our daily work, but we know that should our worst day ever come, you will be there to care for us as well.

That said, please continue working with the leadership of BAWU towards a final contract agreement. From my understanding of the situation, an agreement with the best interests in mind of all parties and the community we all serve is achievable and not far out of reach.
